



Education ReStart Turner Plan Overview

Category	Phase 3
General	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Turner USD 202’s school calendar will be amended to begin classes for students no earlier than September 8th, 2020. ● On-line enrollment registration (OLR) will be extended to August 14th. We ask that families make a decision between Blended and Remote Learning by that time. ● On September 8th, and pending approval by the Wyandotte County Health Department, schools will open at 50% capacity for student instruction and activities. ● Students attending the Technical Education Center at KCKCC may attend class on the TEC campus prior to Labor Day. ● 10 minutes will be added to each school day; 5 minutes at the start and 5 minutes at the end. ● Student athletic conditioning/practice may continue at this point with restrictions. ● Full in-person staffing will occur. ● Two additional full-time sub positions will be hired.
Blended Learning Option	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● To remain compliant with Kansas compulsory attendance requirements, students are required to participate in either “Blended Learning” or “Remote Learning” (see next section) education. ● Students will be assigned to Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday classes with alternating Fridays. ● Children will be assigned days based on household and/or last name. ● Dual and concurrent enrollment students may begin in-person coursework offered on KCKCC property. ● Students will be supported using Schoology during days when instruction occurs at home. Students and parents will be required to maintain a log of time spent learning at home. ● 5th grade band will be postponed beginning no earlier than January, 2021. ● “Morning” Pre-K students will attend on Monday/Wednesday and “Afternoon” Pre-K students will attend on Tuesday/Thursday. Friday Pre-K will be assigned based on student needs. Students will be notified of their schedule following the screening.
Remote Learning Option	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Parents and guardians may choose not to enter their child into Blended Learning, and an online, remote option will be offered. Parents will indicate their preference while enrolling (via OLR) and will receive Remote Learning connection information. Computerized instruction will be used to facilitate Remote Learning instruction. ● Students electing full Remote Learning instruction will receive a curriculum provided through computerized learning. Class selections at the secondary level will be from the computerized programs catalog. Students will be provided instructional support by a USD 202 staff member. ● Part-time enrollment is not permitted. ● Remote Learning students will not be eligible to participate in school activities/athletics. ● When a decision to enroll in Remote Learning is made in the OLR, that decision will be maintained through the first semester.
Physical Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Elementary specials teachers (Art, Music, Physical Education) move to classrooms. ● Physical Education and music classes operate outside as reasonably possible. ● Individual classrooms at all levels will operate as cohorts and will have limited interaction with other classroom cohorts. At the secondary level, this means that students will not rotate between classes. Specific schedule information will be released in the next few weeks. ● Student seating will be spaced as much as possible and desks will be forward-facing.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Non-essential furniture will be removed from classrooms to provide additional space. If staff members need to remove furniture, they should contact an administrator to schedule a time. ● Signage, decals, and directional indicators will be placed in common spaces to increase separation. ● Hallways will have directional guidance; stairwells will be one-way. ● Large group meetings (more than 45 people) will occur virtually. ● Social/community events (Back-to-School night, etc) that include more than 45 non-students will occur virtually. ● Students will have assigned seating on school buses.
Meal Preparation & Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Additional meal periods may occur to provide social distancing. ● Most students will eat breakfast and lunch in classrooms. ● No student self-serve buffet items will be offered. ● “Second chance” breakfast will not be offered. ● All staff wash hands before and after meal preparation and feeding. ● Lunch guests will not be allowed. ● Summer meal pickup will continue at Turner Elementary through August 31st. We are hoping to extend the meal pickup option. ● Our hope is to send additional meals home with students participating in Blended Learning. This is dependent on gaining a waiver from KSDE.
Hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students will bring and use personal water bottles. ● Drinking fountains will not be available. Bottle fillers will be available for use. ● Restroom breaks and hall passes will be scheduled and monitored. ● Staff and children wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (or use hand sanitizer) hourly, particularly upon arrival, before and after eating, using the restroom, before and after playing outdoors or using shared spaces, following any contact with bodily fluid, and before exiting the building. ● Encourage children to not touch hands to eyes, nose or mouths as much as possible. ● Student school supplies will be for individual use only and are not to be shared. ● Student lockers will not be available for use. ● Hand sanitizer will be present in all classrooms.
Cleaning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Surfaces/classrooms will be disinfected each evening using EPA-registered disinfectants. ● Staff disinfect high-touch surfaces, such as door handles, desks, light switches, faucets, toilet seats routinely. ● Equipment used in schools is not shared and is cleaned between uses. ● Materials that cannot be washed are not used. ● Disinfect busses daily.
Personal Protective Equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Masks/face coverings are required for all individuals. All individuals should bring their own personal mask to school. ● Staff or students who are unable to wear a mask due to a reason cited in the Kansas mask/face covering Order will be offered a clear face shield. ● Staff/students will have access to hand sanitizer (at least 60% alcohol) and disposable gloves and use them as needed. ● Staff will wear smocks or gowns when providing direct care or when in physical contact with children with special needs.
Symptom Screening and Response	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Screen students, employees, and visitors for fever and symptoms of COVID-19 with a questionnaire and temperature check. ● Employees who indicate symptoms on the screening or who have a temperature of 100.4 or higher should not report to work and will contact their supervisor. Employees who start to experience symptoms during the day will be referred to the school nurse. Employees will be excluded for 10 days following the first appearance of symptoms and must be fever free for 72 hours without medicine.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Employees and students with COVID-19 symptoms should be denied entry to the school and should be sent promptly for COVID-19 testing at the Wyandotte County Health Department or their primary care physician’s office.● Children who start to experience symptoms of respiratory illness, including a fever of 100.4° F or above and symptoms of other infectious illnesses while at school will be sent home immediately and are advised to get a COVID-19 test at the Wyandotte County Health Department. While waiting to be picked up, the student will be isolated from other children. Children will be excluded for 10 days following the first appearance of symptoms and must fever free for 72 hours without medicine.● When there is confirmation that a person infected with COVID-19 was in a school building, the school will contact the local health department immediately. As one option, the school will close the school building for a minimum of two to five days and work with the local health department to assess factors, such as the likelihood of exposure to employees and students in the building, the number of cases in the community and other factors that will determine when the building should reopen. While the school building is closed, all school activities will be cancelled or rescheduled, regardless of whether the activity was to take place in the building or another location, including extracurricular activities, before and after-school programs and field trips. Parents/students and employees will be encouraged to stay at home until more information is provided by the school or the health department.● As another option, the school may remain open but block off areas where the person infected with COVID-19 was in the school building until the area has been cleaned thoroughly. The school should work with the local health department to assess for close contacts between students and staff and inform those who are exposed that they must start a mandatory 14-day quarantine period.● The school will contact parents/students and employees and notify them that a person who tested positive for COVID-19 was in the building and encourage cooperation with the school and the local health department to trace contacts with the individual. The individual who tested positive will not be identified in communications to the school community at large.
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
