No more than one employee to be physically present in every workspace. District and building administrators will be present. Staff should not congregate in common spaces. Small groups of no more than 10 students/ individuals may gather. Teachers are allowed in classrooms to facilitate online learning or perform other tasks. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parents and guardians may choose not to enter their child into school, and online/remote options should be offered when possible. Schools are allowed to open for student instruction and student activities/ athletics. Students will attend school in shifts; not to exceed 50% of the fire code at a given time. Small groups of students can convene for athletic practices/ conditioning based on KSHSAA guidelines. District and building administrators will be present. Full employee support will be present on all student attendance days. Meal Preparation & Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continued food service may require KSDE waiver. Additional meal periods may occur to provide social distancing. Consider use of additional space for lunch service. No student self-serve buffet items. All staff wash hands before and after meal preparation and feeding. 	
Hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will bring and use personal water bottles. Restroom breaks and hall passes will be scheduled and monitored. Staff and children wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (or use hand sanitizer) often, particularly upon arrival, before and after eating, using the restroom, before and after playing outdoors or using shared spaces, following any contact with bodily fluid, and before exiting the building. Encourage children to not touch hands to eyes, nose or mouths as much as possible. 	
Cleaning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Surfaces/classrooms will be disinfected each evening using EPA-registered disinfectants. Staff disinfect high-touch surfaces, such as door handles, desks, light switches, faucets, toilets seats routinely. Equipment used in schools is not shared and is cleaned between uses. Materials that cannot be washed are not used. Disinfect busses daily. 	
Personal Protective Equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Masks/face coverings are recommended. Employees, visitors, and students may be required to wear masks/face coverings by the Wyandotte County Health Department. Staff/students have access to hand sanitizer (at least 60% alcohol) and disposable gloves and use them as needed. Staff wear smocks or gowns when providing direct care or when in physical contact with children with special needs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff/students have access to hand sanitizer. Face coverings/masks are advised in public when possible.
Symptom Screening	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Screen workers and visitors for fever and symptoms of COVID with a questionnaire. Individuals who indicate symptoms on the screening should not report to work. Individuals who start to experience symptoms during the day will be referred to the school nurse. Individuals should be fever-free for 72 hours, without the use of fever reducing medicines, before returning. Employees and children enrolled in a school with COVID19 symptoms should be denied entry to the school and should be sent promptly for COVID19 testing at the Public Health Department or their primary care physician's office. Children who start to experience symptoms of respiratory illness, including a fever of 100° F or above and symptoms of other infectious illnesses while at school will be sent home immediately and are advised to get a COVID19 test at the WyCo Health Department. While waiting to be picked up, the student will be isolated from other children. Children should be fever-free for 72 hours, without the use of fever reducing medicines, before returning. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children should be fever-free for 24 hours, without the use of fever reducing medicines, before returning.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Upon a positive test of a person associated with the program, consult with the Public Health Department to determine next steps, including when the person who may be infected can return to the program.
