COVID-19 RESOURCES AND ASSISTANCE

Emergency Rental Assistance

Help for families struggling financially due to the COVID-19 pandemic is available through a new program funded by the US Congress. The program is overseen by the US Treasury Department and administered by states, cities and counties in partnership with local community organizations. The Emergency Rental Assistance Program can help families who rent their home get caught up on past due rent and utility bills.

LOW-COST INTERNET OPTIONS

Access From AT&T

Access from AT&T is a low-cost internet option for families based on eligibility. To be eligible, families must participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or be in the free or reduced meal program through their child's school district. Families must show proof of qualifying for free or reduced meals to get Access from AT&T and can get their letter of qualification from our Food Services office, which can be reached at 913-288-4141.

How much does it cost?

Families will receive up to 25 mbps for \$10 per month plus taxes. There are no fees for equipment or installation.

How do I sign up?

Access from AT&T recommends you call them to check service availability in your area. You can contact 1-855-220-5211. You can apply online at att.com/access and will want to be sure you have a picture of your qualification letter for free or reduced lunch for the application process. You will be notified of application approval within 5 - 7 days. AT&T will determine if they can send you the equipment to set up yourself or if they will need to schedule a technician for installation. Please contact AT&T with questions.

Spectrum Internet Assist

Spectrum Internet Assist is a low-cost internet option for families based on eligibility. To be eligible, families cannot be a current Spectrum subscriber and must be in the free or reduced meal program through their child's school district. Families must show proof of qualifying for free or reduced meals to get Spectrum Internet Assist and can get their letter of qualification from our Food Services office, which can be reached at 913-288-4141. If you are not sure if you qualify for free or reduced lunch, you can fill out the application with our Food Services office to check.

How much does it cost?

Families will receive up to 30 mbps starting at \$22.99 per month plus taxes. There are installation fees if the customer is unable to self-install it.

How do I sign up?

To sign up for this offer, families can complete the online application at www.spectrum.com/sia

Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is a Federal Communications Commission program to help families and households struggling to afford internet service during COVID-19. The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

S.O.S. Resources

At the secondary level in TUSD 202, school counselors and social workers have implemented a program called SOS Signs of Suicide. The program teaches students about this difficult topic and encourages them to seek help.

Once per school year at the secondary level, students will watch age-appropriate video clips and participate in a guided discussion about depression, suicide, and what to do if they are concerned about a friend. Following the video, students will complete a response slip which asks whether they would like to talk to an adult about any concerns. School staff will conduct brief meetings with any student asking to talk.
