



## 2021-2022 Education ReStart Turner Plan Overview

Category	Phase 3
General	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Schools are currently open at full capacity for students.</li> <li>• On inclement weather days this season, students will learn remotely. “Remote” students will receive instruction as normal. Meal pick-up from Midland Trail Elementary will be offered via pre-order on the USD 202 Food Service website.</li> <li>• USD 202 is not offering a “Remote” enrollment option for the 2021-2022 school year.</li> <li>• Facility usage by outside groups is not permitted through June 30, 2021.</li> </ul>
In-person Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All students attend school full-time following the regular school calendar.</li> <li>• 5<sup>th</sup> grade band will resume in August 2021.</li> <li>• Part-time enrollment is permitted.</li> </ul>
Physical Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students should remain socially distanced at least 3 feet from other students at all times except for incidental or passing contact.</li> <li>• Certain classes, such as physical education and music, may operate outside as reasonably possible.</li> <li>• Students will have assigned seating on school buses.</li> </ul>
Meal Preparation & Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students are able to eat in cafeterias.</li> <li>• Breakfasts are distributed as students enter the building.</li> <li>• Students may also eat outside safely.</li> <li>• Buffet/salad bars will be offered, but items will be pre-packaged.</li> <li>• All staff wash hands before and after meal preparation and feeding.</li> </ul>
Hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students will bring and use personal water bottles.</li> <li>• Staff and children wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (or use hand sanitizer) hourly, particularly upon arrival, before and after eating, using the restroom, before and after playing outdoors or using shared spaces, following any contact with bodily fluid, and before exiting the building.</li> <li>• Encourage children to not touch hands to eyes, nose, or mouths as much as possible.</li> <li>• Student lockers are available for use.</li> <li>• Hand sanitizer is present in all classrooms.</li> </ul>
Cleaning and Facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Surfaces/classrooms are disinfected each evening using EPA-registered disinfectants.</li> <li>• Staff disinfect high-touch surfaces, such as door handles, desks, light switches, faucets, toilet seats routinely.</li> <li>• Any items that come into contact with multiple students will require hand sanitizing/hand washing prior to touching the item as well as sanitizing of the item before and after use.</li> <li>• Disinfect busses daily.</li> <li>• Heating/Cooling/Air quality upgrades will occur throughout district buildings.</li> </ul>
Personal Protective Equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Masks/face coverings are recommended for all individuals. Individuals choosing to wear a mask should bring their own personal mask to school.</li> <li>• Staff/students will have access to hand sanitizer (at least 60% alcohol) and disposable gloves and use them as needed.</li> <li>• Staff may wear smocks or gowns when providing direct care or when in physical contact with children with special needs.</li> </ul>
Symptom Screening and Response	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Employees and students with COVID-19 symptoms should be denied entry to the school and tested for COVID-19. Clinical symptom criteria is at least one of the following: fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, OR at least two of the following symptoms: chills, stiffness or rigidity, muscle aches or pain, headache, sore throat, changes in smell or taste, stomach or abdominal pain/vomiting/diarrhea.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Children who start to experience symptoms of respiratory illness, including a fever of 100.4° F or above and symptoms of other infectious illnesses while at school will be sent home immediately. While waiting to be picked up, the student will be isolated from other children. They will be offered a COVID-19 test by the school nurse. While awaiting test results, the student must isolate at home. If negative, the student should return to school after their symptoms resolve. If positive, they should stay isolated for 10 days past the onset of symptoms or until they are fever free for 72 hours, whichever is longer.</li> <li>● Saliva-based COVID-19 testing is available at all schools. Testing will be recommended when students/staff are symptomatic. For students, parent consent will be required.</li> <li>● USD 202 will continue to work with the Unified Government Public Health Department to provide additional opportunities for COVID-19 vaccinations.</li> </ul>
Academic Recovery	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Turner has hired additional instructional positions to intervene with identified students who have academic needs. These positions include content specialists in literacy and math at every building. Secondary schools will receive “transition specialists” to support students who are at-risk due to instructional losses. Permanent substitutes will also be hired.</li> <li>● Increasing instructional time will occur through extended day tutoring and a comprehensive extended year program during the current and following summer. Summer schools will occur at each level in our district as well as secondary credit recovery. In-person instruction will be offered in these settings.</li> <li>● Socially/Emotionally, we plan to support students and staff through trauma-sensitive resources and an updated elementary social/emotional curriculum. Secondary schools will also have expanded advocacy programs.</li> </ul>
